Council Resolution 24-2

Supporting Opportunities for Summer Language Study

WHEREAS, immersion experiences for study of a foreign language offer students the only avenue toward true fluency of a language.

WHEREAS, an understanding of multiple languages is an invaluable asset for a college graduate in this era of global citizenship.

WHEREAS experience outside of the United States is transformative for the depth and maturation of a student's personal and academic world view.

WHEREAS, circumstances such as curricular requirements, positions in student government, athletic seasons, etc. prevent many Vassar students from experiencing language immersion programs during the academic year.

WHEREAS, almost two-thirds of Vassar's student body receives financial aid and many of these students are unable to fund summer travel experiences independently.

WHEREAS, budgetary reductions have necessitated the cancellation of Vassar's summer language programs.

#### BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

THE VSA STRONGLY SUPPORTS the availability of high quality, affordable summer opportunities for immersion-based language learning.

THE VSA URGES the senior officers and the language departments to develop cost-effective alternatives to the eliminated programs that enable students without financial means for independent travel.

THE VSA PROMOTES collaboration among departments and offices (including but not limited to the Fellowships Office, the Career Development Office, and the JYA Office) to create alternative opportunities for students to study language during the summer
